We are glad to know that the Evangelical Fellowship of Anglican Churchmen of South Africa have recently sent a complimentary copy of the book Sacrament, Sacrifice, and Eucharist by the Rev. A. M. Gordon Savage, Bishop of Buckingham, to visit South Africa in connexion with the tercentenary of the Book of Common Prayer. He will be conducting Teaching Missions in the Transvaal, Natal, and Cape Town, and speaking at their annual Conference at Stutterheim from September 4 to 7.
